Virtual patient simulation in pharmacy education: A systematic review

purpose of this The first research paper was to determine how virtual patient simulation (VPS) affected pharmacy students' perceptions, knowledge, and abilities. It was concluded that VPS improves decision-making clinical abilities and knowledge. It can also satisfy the requirements of pharmacy students who prefer active learning.

This second research is an eye opener. It is commonly known that there is no treatment for Alzheimer's Disease. However, according to the following research, the U.S. FDA has given Aducanumab (a novel monoclonal antibody that targets beta-amyloid aggregates) conditional approval for the treatment of moderate Alzheimer's disease (AD).

Aducanumab is the first diseasemodifying medication for AD. Unfortunately, this medication only partially treats the underlying pathophysiology of AD. Hence, several treatments must be used in future AD interventions for the illness to be effectively treated.
